

Phishing for Trouble 2.2 – online cybercrime training

Law firms continue to fall victim to cybercrime. The current ransomware epidemic is only one phase in an unrelenting series of attacks.

In 2015 we produced a short online course, *Phishing for Trouble*, which was used by firms across the spectrum, including major City practices. Feedback included:

Our current product is *Phishing for Trouble 2.2*. It aims to renew and raise awareness, and it addresses emerging threats. No prior knowledge is required.

Our new course is:

1. Up to the minute, fresh. It has not been sitting on a shelf. It is responsive to the swiftness of the cyber criminals.
2. User-friendly. We are practising solicitors ourselves, and we present the issues from the perspective of IT users, not IT professionals.
3. Focussed where the threats lurk. Because we are practising solicitors, we look at the wider range of cyber threats law firms face, not just the threat to the firm’s bank accounts.

The course takes 15 minutes or so to complete, and it costs £8 plus VAT per head (minimum 3 delegates). Discounts apply for volume, on a sliding scale: the price for an unlimited number of users is £3,000 plus VAT.
